When you think, you know it, then you only imagine that you're knowing it....!

So there you are, self-confident, thinking that you're ready for a new monkey-species which shouldn't be much trouble and then...

Working in a zoo for about 30 years and working with several different species you're looking forward to get new, interesting and fascinating primates. I was interested in them for quite a while and after seeing these primates in other zoos and speaking with the colleagues who keep this species successfully for a long time I really got excited. We also knew the curator who has the studbook personally so that we could contact him in any case of emergency.

So every member of the team of "Borgori Woods" in Frankfurt was happy to accommodate Drills and take care of them.

We all agreed that it shouldn't be difficult to keep the Drills. When the animals arrived in May 2008 everything was fine. Nothing unusual happened.

So the beginning of Drill-keeping was "easy going". The get-together of the 3 Drills from Hannover Zoo and the male Drill from Saarbrucken was peaceful. Managing the animals, like feeding and conducting them from one habitat to the other was easy. The only "problem" was the fact that all plants in the enclosure were eaten by the Drills. Especially the roots and barks of the trees.

The whole situation is really strange because the Drills are eating all the time, nonstop. First we thought the reason for this is our calorie-reduced diet. We asked the keepers from other zoos and they told us that the Drills are behaving in a normal way.

So the animals grew and gained weight (especially "Ricardo", he has quite a belly by now, we should keep an eye on that!).

As an alternative environmental enrichment we put a thick layer of litter with dried leaves on top into the enclosures. The Drills are now digging through it in the search for something delicious.

The social order of the group still gives us a headache. We haven't seen an improvement yet. Which means that there's no grooming between the individuals, The male Drill from Saarbrucken (his name's "Tschepo") separates from the group (so we all call him "the lonely": greetings to Northern Germany). Even though he's clearly the alpha male who has the privilege to eat first and to investigate new situations first while the others back away, he has no interest in the females. "Ricardo" on the contrary loves to sit with the females, so that the 3 Hannoveranian Drills stick together most of the times.

At the moment we give them filled bamboo and boxes with food of different shapes and sizes to keep them busy. We got one special box developed by a highly motivated student for our orang utans. We also took this box to the Drills and they managed to get the food out of it in about two minutes.

So as a conclusion the Drills are still a riddle for us. They brought us all back to basics. But still we are excited to have them by all means and hopefully they become a real group with family-ties before we socialize them with Guerezas and Gorillas.

Annual General Meeting at Hagenbeck's Zoo

I'd like to give a short summary about the meeting to all members who couldn't get to the AGM in Hamburg personally.

Having a free entrance and an interesting guiding-tour through the new tropical-aquarium our meeting started at 2 o'clock p.m. at the winter restaurant of Hagenbeck's Zoo.

After a friendly welcome by Mr. Wolters, the Zoo inspector, we listened to two interesting speeches: The first one was held by Tony Kershaw, our chairman, who told us news about the Drill, our foundation and our future goals.

One of the news from "Pandrillus" in Nigeria was that the reintroduction of the Drills to the Afi Mountains will be delayed to 2009.

The second speech was held by Dr. Heike Weber. She gave us an interesting report about her visit to two sanctuaries in Cameroon.

She referred about the work with primates in these sanctuaries as well as about the social life of the people in the homeland of the Drills.

After that the official part of the AGM started.

The cash auditors, Mr. Carlo Rinke and Dr. Antje Hermanns declared the cashier's work has been correct and ordered to release the chairmen. This was done in unison.
